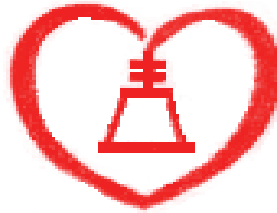

VIP Background and Mission

- The mission of the Volunteer Center of Riverside County is to link people in need with those who can help. The Volunteer Center of Riverside County has a 42-year history developing programs in response to community need
- The Alternative Sentencing Program, is a division of the Volunteer Center, providing the Judicial System Alternative Sentencing Options for over 37 years. Programs such as TEMPO, AWARE, DOMESTIC VIOLENCE MONITORING and COMMUNITY SERVICE COMPONENT, THE VICTIM IMPACT PANEL (MADD), and THE HOME DETENTION PROGRAM: Electronic Home Monitoring with in home alcohol testing.
- MADD (Mothers Against Drunk Driving), Alternative Sentencing Program and Riverside County Judicial System is a collaborative effort to educate Riverside County clients of the negative consequences of being under the influence of a control substance while driving or in public.

WHAT IS VIP

VIP is an eight hour, multi-component, drug and alcohol education program

- Alternative sentencing/court diversion option for young adults identified at risk.
- Early intervention program for ALL Ages.
- Exposes clients to the legal, financial, emotional and social consequences of driving while impaired.
- Collaborative program, supported and presented by Mothers Against Drunk Drivers—Riverside County Chapter, Riverside County Coroners Office and Riverside County Judicial System.



GOALS OF VIP

- To educate and expose at risk youth offenders and young adults to the realities of driving while impaired and their choices related to drugs/alcohol.
- To educate VIP clients on the negative impact on their family, friends, and community.
- To educate responsible decision making related to Alcohol and Drugs
- To reduce injuries and deaths.



VIP DOES NOT

- Condemn or pass judgment
- Preach alcohol/drug abstinence
- Accept or approve irresponsible behavior

HOW VIP WORKS

The Volunteer Center of Riverside County administers and is responsible for the day to day operations.

- Participants are referred by: Riverside County Courts, Probation and may be Self Referred.
- Cost/fees: \$100.00 Payment schedules and sliding scale are available
- Participants must complete the 8 hour program requirements before a certificate is awarded.

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

- 1) Intake Interview at Participating Volunteer Center of Riverside County Office's =1 hr.
- 2) Coroner's Video and MADD Victim Impact Panel Presentation = 2 hrs.
- 3) Independent home activity 1000 word essay = 4 hrs.
- 4) Debriefing and Exit interview =1hr.

TOTAL PROGRAM HOURS =8 hrs.
