To date, FUNDamental Concepts has raised over \$300 million for nonprofit and public agencies in the Inland Empire. The largest grant received was \$5.2 million.

She has had formal training in grant writing from the Foundation Center, United Way of America and Cal State University San Bernardino. She has been a formal trainer for the Inland Empire Nonprofit Conference, the Support Center of San Diego, UCR Extension - Nonprofit Management Certificate Program, Riverside County Department of Public and Social Services, LA County Office of Education, RIMS Healthy Start Network, and Southern CA Fire Safe Councils. Michelle pursued a BS Degree in Sociology from the University of VA, 1978, and is currently in the process of obtaining Grant Professionals Certification (G.P.C) from the American Association of Grant Professionals. Her home-based business is located in the mountain community of Running Springs.
