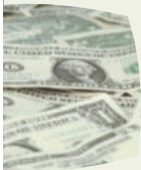

What an organization's management staff doesn't know could hurt them and their organization. Human Resources issues have become an area of increasing litigation for organizations. Human Resource professionals, managers, and organizational directors need to understand the laws and regulations governing the employer/employee relationship. Nonprofit organizations face difficult challenges today that make the strategic management of human resources crucial. HR requirements in specific areas in regard to volunteers will be discussed.
